Spider Legs by Rebecca DeGroot



Rebecca DeGroot was born and raised with her three brothers in Michigan. With their woodworking father and a stay at home artist mother, she and her brothers have never been short of inspiration. Rebecca and her brothers were homeschooled from an early age, therefore given the opportunity to explore their forty acres and appreciate the nature and wildlife.

Throughout her young life, she developed her love of teaching and sharing information with others. She later went on to pursue an education at Kendall College of Art and Design of Ferris State University in Grand Rapids,

MI. After six years and an assortment of interesting twists and turns, she gained two bachelor's degrees; one in Art education and the other in Sculpture and Functional Art. Before graduation, she received an offer to teach high school art at a school in Houston,



Texas. The summer after graduation, she packed her things and made her way down to Texas to start this new and exciting chapter of her life. While it has been a challenge these past four years, Rebecca has always found time in her busy teaching schedule to create her own art. She now juggles teaching art, demonstrating woodworking and woodturning, and maintaining the regular production of her own gallery work. Eventually, Rebecca would like to focus all of her time on demonstrating and creating her own work, but we will have to wait and see when that dream will be made into a reality.



At the meeting, Rebecca will be demonstrating design basic concepts and the steps to create a three-legged bowl in her own style. She will be showing her own process of basic bowl turning, plotting an oversized foot, drilling and power carving the foot into “hips”, turning the spindles for the legs, cutting the legs apart, using splines to reinforce the leg joints, then reassembling the parts into a finished piece. If there’s time left over, she can go over embellishment techniques such as applying TransTint dyes, gold leafing, pyrography, and unexpected additive carved components.

President's Pen for June 2018

It's hot (not that that is news) and the couch potato in me has gained dominance. Sitting in the a/c with a cool drink in hand is much preferred to sweating buckets on newly turned wood projects. This too shall pass, I know that but in the mean time no chips are made. Then I start thinking about all the yesterday's when a/c was rare, window fans were the best you had and we still got things done.

I recently had a birthday and with all my birthday money plus a little extra, I bought a new bowl gouge. Of course it came with very specific instructions on how to maintain the best edge. I have mentioned in the past about ongoing conversations about the best sharpening jig/setup/etc. But I keep learning. All these people aren't wrong, so I keep working on the best edge I can replicate time after time.

Ever watch "The Woodwright's Shop"? It stars Roy Underhill using hand tools to make some incredible works. The one thing that fascinates me is how sharp his tools are. Tools that sharp don't require a 2HP electric motor. He cuts dados, mortise and tenon joints, etc. with great ease. I think the same is true for woodturning. The sharper the tools, the easier the task. That is a lesson that I have a hard time remembering.

I have been experimenting with creating and using a negative rake scraper. Lots of different ways to create one and a basic utilization technique. But again, it is something that must be practiced to be mastered. I'll let you know if I ever get there.

Well, it has been 6 months since the new board took office and we are melding into a cohesive unit. At this last meeting we started discussing upcoming demonstrations and what we might do for the next week long hands on session. We could use your help! Who would you like to see? What techniques would you like to see up close and personal? Who would you like to spend a day in the shop with learning new and different turning techniques? Share your ideas with your board.

Remember, our next meeting is open shop. Come and learn. Come and share. Come and eat a hot dog.

Each year, the SouthWest Association of Turners (SWAT) holds one of the largest woodturning symposiums in the world.

In 2017, nearly 900 attendees enjoyed this outstanding event in Waco, Texas. SWAT is an all-volunteer organization which allows the price to remain affordable low. The Symposium features nationally and internationally recognized turners, as well as outstanding regional turners selected from participating clubs and across the country.

The 2018 Symposium will be the 27th Anniversary of SWAT and will be held on August 24-26 at the Waco Convention Center, 100 Washington Ave, Waco, Texas.

The SWAT Symposium will offer something for every level of Woodturner.

The Symposium features:

- 1. An Art Gallery where attendees may display up to 10 art pieces of their work (Some will be for sale).*
- 2. The Banquet on Saturday night is highlighted with a drawing for beautiful turned art pieces.*

3. A continuation of the drawing (using the same tickets, hence 2 for 1) will be held at noon on Sunday. This drawing will consist of 2 full size lathes Two large lathes: a Robust and a prAxis., Three new Jet 1221 Midi Lathes, assorted wood, turning tools, turning accessories.

4. There will be around 55 vendors on site selling equipment and supplies at very competitive prices.

5. Lunches are provided during the three-day event for paid attendees.

6. There will be 63(up from 54 in previous years) demonstrations which make up the seminar.

There will also be the Ashley Harwood Versus Buddy Compton who then versus Stuart Batty competition on Friday night.

7. There will be areas to offer hands on opportunities to turn something of choice. Turn a Pen, Sharpen a tool, good opportunity for one on one coaching from highly trained individuals.

8. Bring your Spouse. There is a full schedule of Activities for special classes designed for the non-turning Spouse available for signup on the [SWAT](#) website under Family Programs.



Last Month's Critique



EMPTY BOWLS

Empty Bowls is an annual one-day fund raising event for the Tarrant Area Food Bank. The Food Bank provides food to sister agencies in 13 surrounding counties. The sister agencies then provide the food to needy children and families. Patrons at the Empty Bowls event pay \$65 or more and get to choose a bowl (wood, ceramic or glass) to take home and sample food from numerous booths of local restaurants. There are also numerous corporate sponsors that provide a sizeable portion of the total donations.

The March 2018 event raised \$249,000 , which is slightly more than last year.

The next Empty Bowls event will be May 1, 2019.

We had 17 bowls donated last month bringing our grand total to 51 turned items. Jerry Newton turned in 9 which was more than half the total. We are a long way from our goal of 300 so please do you part and help out. The hot days are here to stay for a while so get out in your shop early before it gets too hot and make a bowl to help feed the hungry people.


