#### **Phil Brennion Coming to Dallas**

Dallas Area Woodturners is bringing Phil Brennion to Dallas for three days of demonstrations and hands-on teaching. Phil will do an all-day demo on Saturday, Sept. 14, 2002, and will conduct hands-on workshops on Sunday and Monday, Sept. 15 and 16, 2002.

Phil is a turner of national repute. He lives, turns, and teaches in rural central Arizona. He is on the Board of Directors of the American Association of Woodturners. He teaches turning and sculpting wood at Yavapai College in Prescott, Arizona. Phil's specialty is southwest style turnings. He is a student of native American art, and creates shapes and surface treatments which reflect this interest. He is also a teacher of general woodturning, and will tailor the hands-on workshops to the needs and interests of the students. I have seen Phil demonstrate at the AAW Symposium, and his easygoing manner and turning skill is a pleasure to see.

The Saturday all-day demo starts at 9 AM at Mike Pregent's shop, located at 300 S. Kirby, Suite C, Garland TX 75042. Maps are available on the DAW website, or from Bob Larson or myself—I have a WORD file with the map. Cost is \$20, payable at the door. Sunday and Monday hands-on will be at Jimmie Arledge's shop, 501 Vernet, in Richardson. Each hands-on day is limited to 5 students. Cost is \$100 for an entire day. If you are planning to attend the Saturday demo, Bob would appreciate a call as well, so he can count heads for seating purposes.

### Story from the Badger Pond Woodworking Forum on the WEB

He hadn't turned in a while. And decided to rough-turn a large piece he had acquired. He mounted the blank on the lathe, gave it a spin by hand, pushed the start button and............. He woke up on the floor in a pool of blood and barely able to see. With the help of his wife he got to the ER. He had over a hundred stitches in and around his mouth, a broken nose. Some loose teeth, and double vision. He considered himself lucky that he wasn't killed. He had made one of the worst mistakes one can make in woodturning. HE DIDN'T CHECK THE SPEED SETTING. He had been turning some small spindles, and the speed was around 3000 RPM!! He is now back to woodturning and he wears a face shield when turning. The wood lathe one of the safest machines in the shop to use, but only when used properly.
