September Demonstrator – Larry Hancock

Biography:

I have been turning since the mid '80's. I turned spindles mainly for several years. I have since expanded my turning to include most anything that can be created on the lathe from crochet hooks to hats. I have been a member and secretary of The Central Oklahoma Woodturners Association, founding member and officer of the Woodturners of Southern Oklahoma, and a member of the Woodturners of North Texas. I teach and give demonstrations on turning in Oklahoma and Texas.

Demo:

I will be showing how to use simple texturing and coloring techniques to produce Southwest style pottery forms. I will show how to layout a symmetrical feather pattern on a hollow form, use dremel tools to cut away wood to define the pattern. I will cover options for coloring or bleaching the wood to make the designs standout more. The techniques can be used to enhance turned wood in a theme like these southwest style or many other designs can be created.

The Holiday Banquet:

A number of years ago a Club member by the name of Suzanne Grantham had a question. What do we do for a December meeting?
