TURNING A COVERED DISH

- 1. Decide the size and shape of the dish. Then make a blank with a tenon or waste block on both ends.
- 2. Mark where the divide between the top and bottom will be. The bottom will be about 1/3rd if a knob is part of the top.
- 3. With parting tool make a cut about 1" deep at the top edge of the bottom. Then make an adjacent cut about 3/8" wide about 1/8" deep at the bottom edge of the lid, this will be the male edge connecting the top and bottom.
- 4. Form the rim of top and bottom.
- 5. Make the basic shape of the bottom and the top.
- 6. Part off the top.
- 7. Using a shear scraping cut finish the outside of the bottom up to the tenon.
- 8. Finish the rim and hollow the inside. Sand the bottom inside and out.
- 9. Remove the bottom and mount the top.
- 10. Fit the top and bottom together making a jam chuck fit.
- 11. Form the outside of the top to the knob without disturbing the waste block or tenon.
- 12. Hollow out the top. Sand the inside.
- 13. Remove the top and remount the bottom.
- 14. Join the top to the bottom and bring up the tailstock to hold it in place.
- 15. Finish the outside edge of the top, then use tape to help hold the pieces together.
- 16. Finish the remainder of the top, if the knob is a part of the top, finish it as much as possible before removing the tailstock, then finish the knob and sand.
- 17. Remove the top and part off the bottom.
- 18. If desired use a vacuum chuck or friction chuck to finish off the bottom, sand and apply desired finish to the piece.
