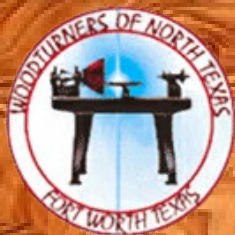

## CA Finishing of Vessels by Alan Trout



San Antonio, Texas is my home and I have lived in the area all my life. My home and studio are in the Tobin Hill neighborhood at the northern edge of downtown.

The last few years I have focused my work on what I like to call my "Syntho Organic" forms. I blend brightly

pigmented acrylic resins with wood and other organic materials. All are finished with a glasssmooth or soft luster finish. My daily environment influences my work more than anything else. My family, the places I go, the things I see, and childhood memories all have a

significant impact on my work. I like to think I see the “abstract” in my environment.

I pour a little piece of myself into everything that I make. I create for myself, but when others get enjoyment out of my work, it makes it that much better.

== CA finish: It's not just for pens ==

CA finishing of vessels and other forms can be durable, quick, and with a little practice, an easy finish to apply. I began using this finish on my smaller turnings several years ago. Since then, I have started using it on larger pieces as well.

I wanted a gloss finish I could apply on the lathe without any spray equipment, which had the durability of a catalyzed spray finish. Spraying small pieces is wasteful of time and material.

Pen turners gave me this idea...I had a pen that was about 8 years old with a CA finish that held up better than its plating. So I knew durability was excellent, but was told by several people that the application was an issue and that it couldn't be done on pieces as large as I wanted to do.

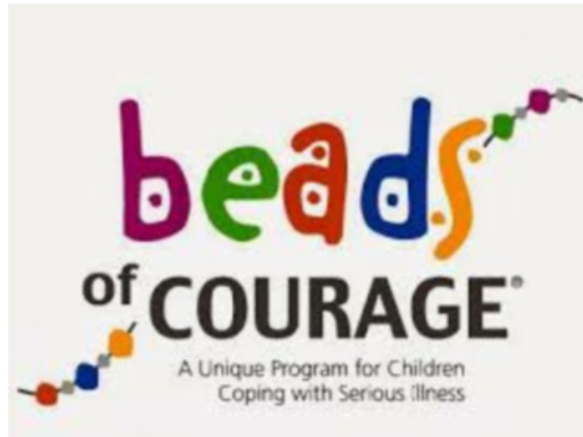
# Last Month's Critique

### Beads of Courage Program

The Beads of Courage program has had a good start but we need to begin knowing how many have been completed or are in the final stages. We have not been called to turn any in yet but they could at any time.

For the boxes that have been used at the hospital before Waco in August, we will take a picture and include it with those we take to Waco to display. There is no contest but they do want to have a display. This is a part of our clubs community support.

Just remember these lidded bowls are going to children. The bowls do not have to be super large or super fancy (but they can be), but they need to be functional for a child to store his or her beads.

We would like to see at least 25 new bowls this year. We are working with Robson Ranch wood workers so, with their flat wood boxes and ours, it is hoped we can meet the needs of the hospital. The Golden Triangle Woodturners have joined us to supply lidded boxes to our Hospitals. Our ladies have also made great looking B of C bags.

# ***EMPTY BOWLS***

Empty Bowls is an annual fund raising event for the Tarrant Area Food Bank. The Food Bank provides food to sister agencies in 13 surrounding counties. The sister agencies then provide the food to needy children and families. Patrons at the Empty Bowls event pay \$60 or more and get to choose a bowl (wood, ceramic and glass) to take home and sample food from numerous booths of local restaurants. There are also numerous corporate sponsors that provide a sizeable portion of the total donations.

This last February the event raised \$241,000, slightly more than last year. The next Empty Bowls event will be in March 2018. We have accumulated 54 bowls and one other item. Jimmie Gill even brought four bowls all the way from College Station. What a guy! Larry Roberts contributed two bowls under anonymous but I put them under his name anyway. Keep them coming. We have a long way to go to get to a respectable number by March, 2018.

## SWAT 2017

### Waco Convention Center

**Fri. August 25th thru Sun. August 27th, 2017**

Each year, the SouthWest Association of Turners (SWAT) holds one of the largest woodturning symposiums in the world. In 2017, nearly 1000 attendees enjoyed this outstanding event in Waco, Texas. Swat is an all-volunteer organization which allows the price to remain affordable low.

The Symposium features nationally and internationally recognized turners, as well as outstanding regional turners selected from participating clubs and across the country. The 2017 Symposium will be held on August 25-27 at the Waco Convention Center, 100 Washington Ave, Waco, Texas. The SWAT Symposium will offer something for every level of Woodturner.

### The Symposium features:

1. An Art Gallery where attendees may display up to 10 art pieces of their work (Some will be for sale).
2. The Banquet on Saturday night is highlighted with a drawing for beautiful turned art pieces.
3. A continuation of the drawing (using the same tickets) will be held at noon on Sunday. This drawing will consist of 2 full size lathes, a Robust and a prAxis and three new Jet 1221 Midi lathes, and a large assortment of woodturning tools and accessories.
4. There will be around 55 vendors on site selling equipment and supplies at very competitive prices.
5. Lunches are provided during the three-day event for paid attendees.
6. In addition to the 54 demonstrations, five Special Interest Group sessions are planned.
7. There will be three areas to offer hands on opportunities to turn something of choice, Turn a Pen, or Sharpen a tool, good opportunity for one on one coaching from highly trained individuals.

8. Bring your Spouse, SWAT will have a full schedule of Activities for special classes designed for the non-turning Spouse.

### **Instant Gallery**



**Who:** Any SWAT registered attendee, vendor or demonstrator.

**Where:** Check items into Art Gallery Waco Convention Center, McLennan Room 208, submit only through Art Gallery representatives.

**When:** August 24, 2017..after 3:00 p.m., or during the Symposium hours on August 25-27, 2017.

**Entry Fee:** None

**Limit of items submitted:** No more than 10 per artist. Inventory form required.

### **New for 2017**

This year we are introducing a new feature designed to make displaying your pieces in the Art Gallery easier. You can now use the on-Line Gallery Check-In Form to register your pieces. When you arrive at the symposium, you will find your labels and check-in form already printed and ready to sign-and-go instead of having to fill out the forms. You can access this on the SWAT website under Gallery Registration.

**Personal Business Cards:** No personal business cards will be displayed in the Art Gallery.

**Selling of items on display:** All sales will be handled by the artist and the interested party. Art Gallery representatives take no responsibility in these transactions.

## BEADS of Courage



**Beads of Courage entrees:** These items are submitted at a separate check in table to a Beads of Courage and/or Art Gallery representative rather than general check-in. No inventory form required. The SWAT Symposium took on the Beads of Courage program in 2010 inspired by Craig Fyock, owner of Wood World, Texas. Each year the contributions for the Beads of Courage by SWAT attendees and support of our vendors has exceeded the previous year, with 149 boxes in 2014. **Note: We are sorry, but unlike previous years we will not be Judging or giving prizes for the top Beads-of-Courage entries this year.**

## This years Lead Turners:

### James Duxbury

**Traditional kaleidoscopes** — Demonstration exposes turners to the basics of Kaleidoscopes.

**Illusions**—Unique decorative four center turning, creating a spatial third dimension.

### Trent Bosch

**Revelations In Hollowing** - The creation of a hollow forming using the latest technologies.

**Sunburst platter** - creating a platter from green wood and then adding a sunburst pattern.



**Vessels of Illusion**—turning the outer hollow form, carving the vessel, turning an insert and using wood bending to get the insert into the outer vessel.

**Natural Edge Nested Sets** - Using the Kelton system, turning a natural edge nested set from green wood.

**Hawaiian Calabash Bowl** - Creating this pleasing shape from start to finish, oil and Beall buffing.

**Sunny side Up Egg on a Plate** - Creating this unique piece, a plate with egg white and a yellow yolk instead of a frying pan on a stove.

**Pyrography Tips and tricks** - Using commercially made pyrography pens as well as nichrome wire and making a brand out of a copper rivet.

**Making Mini Vessels and Carving** - Textures - using a spindle gouge, detail gouge, and homemade allen wrench hollowers, then carved and textured.

Al Hockenbery

**Sand Carving** - use low cost sand blasting techniques to add images, designs, and texture to turnings by using resist to define the blasted areas.

**Natural Edge Bowl from a Crotch** - Selecting and preparing the blank, design options, and turning techniques that minimize sanding.

**Turning Triangles** - Unique multi-center turning - three sided napkins rings, ornaments and two sided turnings.

**Skew Skills—key “dance moves”** - ultra-clean cuts and making eggs and elegantly embellished finger-tip spinning tops

**Square-rimmed Bowls** - Creating a bowl with an outward flowing rim using a square-cornered blank
